COURSE DESCRIPTION

This workshop will show students a fun way of putting many flat smaller pieces of wood together to create a large organic free form. Using this technique, each student will build a large dinner-table sized centerpiece bowl, and wall pieces starting from a flat board of lumber instead of a chunk of log.

If you have access to wood in your area, and would like to bring your own to use or share with fellow classmates, please familiarize yourself with laws and regulations in bringing wood across state lines before doing so. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has requirements

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in place to help protect the environment locally and nationally that are regulated on federal and/or state levels.
